Located at 250 W. Social Row Road in Washington Township. They are a nursing home that has adults receiving rehab and also long term care. They would love to have any pet therapy teams visit their facility and are flexible when the visits take place. The visits will be done bedside or group visits and if the weather cooperates it could be done outside if you would prefer. It is required that you wear a mask, have a TB Test and a COVID rapid test prior to visiting.

Kingston of Miamisburg

Located at 1120 Dunaway St in Miamisburg. They are a nursing home facility that would love to have pet therapy teams visit their residents in bedside or group visits. They are open to having any type of animal come and visits can take place any day or time of the week. All visitors must wear a mask and have a COVID test if you are not vaccinated. Also, depending on how much visiting your are doing you may need to complete a back ground check and TB test.

Piqua Manor

Located at 1840 West High St in Piqua is a nursing home that would love to have bedside and group visits. They are open to having any pet therapy animals come to their facility. The visits can take place any day or time of the week. All volunteers must complete their volunteer form and submit a vet check form. Volunteers must also wear a mask and have their temperature checked prior to visiting.

Ohio Hospice of Dayton

Has resumed pet therapy visits. All employees and volunteers at Ohio Hospice of Dayton must have a COVID vaccine prior to visiting. Ohio Hospice of Dayton is located at 324 Wilmington Ave in Dayton.


MEMBER NEWS
